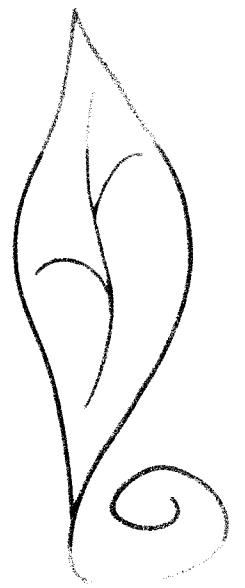
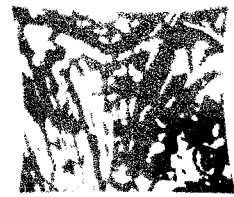

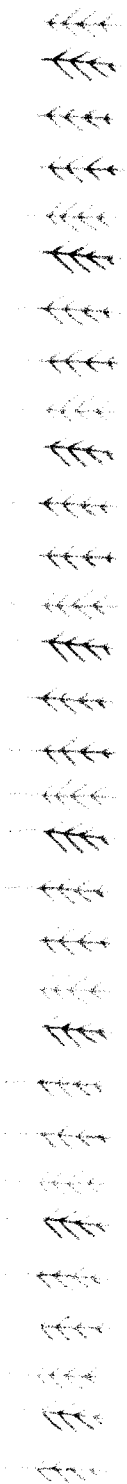

New Jersey State Police.

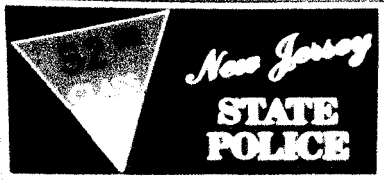
